



Discover the Medieval Castles of Transylvania

Transylvania – the land of many legends is home to castles, fortified churches and rich gastronomy. This journey will provide you with an authentic picture of the villages and most representative towns of Transylvania.

PELES AND PELISOR CASTLE - *Summer residence of Romania's kings*

The Peles castle was built by the first King of Romania, Carol I of Hohenzollern – Sigmaringen, between 1873 and 1914. By 1883, the year of its inauguration, it was used as summer residence. Pelisor Castle is part of the vast architectural ensemble created by King Carol I, along the Peles river's valley, during the entire period of his reign. It was built between 1899 and 1902, as a residence for the Royal Heirs to the throne of Romania, Prince Ferdinand and Princess Marie.



BRAN CASTLE - *Dracula's nest*

Bran Castle: Let's visit Dracula's nest! Sitting high on top of a cliff in the middle of Transylvania, Bran Castle is surrounded by an aura of mystery tied to both the myth of Bram Stoker's Count Dracula and the infamous Vlad Tepes—also known as Vlad the Impaler—who is said to have made Bran Castle his home.



BRASOV - *The Magnificent Transylvanian Medieval Town*

Being surrounded by the mountains, Brasov has one of the best-preserved old towns in Europe. This city provides a mix of fantastic mountain scenery and medieval history with German influences in the old town.

We start the day with a walking tour in the old town of Brasov: beautiful medieval buildings painted in vivid colors displaying the essence of the Saxon architecture essence. The Town Hall and the Black Church are the only two survivors of the Great Fire, which destroyed the city late 17 century. The fortifications of the Old City, its bastions and its gate bring a medieval-romantic flavor to your tour.

VISCRI - *Prince Charles' Favorite Place in Romania*

This village combines the peaceful countryside atmosphere with the grandeur of its fortress, serving as a vivid testament to the rich past of this region. The Prince of Wales owns an 18th-century guest house in the village of Viscri.
